Call to Confession

One: In the Gospel of Luke, the angel Gabriel tells Mary two things: that she is highly favored, and that she is going to have a child. Mary's response to this news is simple. With awestruck authenticity, she asks, "How can this be?"

- All: Thanks be to God! May we believe it. Amen.



Chapel / Zoom This Sunday, Adult Education continues looking at Advent, discussing *On the Way to Bethlehem*, by Rob Fuquay.

The book helps us look at towns and cities that were key to the story of the birth of Jesus. In the second chapter, we move to Jerusalem. Here, we encounter Zechariah as he ministers in the temple and has a visit from an angel. He and his wife Elizabeth have been waiting and hoping for a child into their old age. The

angel says their wait will soon be over – John (the baptizer) will be their son. We learn about their struggle as they have waited – and as they look toward their late-in-life surprise. The author encourages us to try to be patient in waiting on God.

Please join us this Sunday to continue the journey to Bethlehem. This week, we welcome Michele Vickery as our leader. We will begin the class with a brief video by the author.

We encourage you to read the second chapter of the book, to enhance your understanding and the application of this study to your own journey. Books are available in the church office.
