## Homelessness in Chicago

- 24K people live on the street or in a shelter (+7,985 from previous year)
- 44K couch surf or live doubled-up (-5,156 from previous year)
- 68,440 Chicagoans could be considered homeless
- Increase of 2,829 people from previous year
- This is almost 2.5% of our population




## Homelessness in Chicago

- 18,836 residents experiencing homelessness on night of PIT
  - 17,202 residing in shelter; 1,634 unsheltered (65% increase)
  - 13,679 of sheltered population were new arrivals; 212 of unsheltered population were new arrivals
- While just under 1/3 of Chicago residents identify as Black, 72% of non-new arrivals experiencing homelessness identify as Black

The Night Ministry provides human connection, housing support, and health care to members of our community who are unhoused or experiencing poverty.





### Our History

- We were founded in 1976 by a diverse group of faith congregations who wanted to address individuals struggling with homelessness, isolation, and despair.
- Our first employee, Reverend Tom Behrens, met with these individuals at night providing a ministry of presence, what we now refer to as human connection.

### Health Outreach Bus



- Operates from 3pm to 7:30pm, Sunday through Thursday
- 2 stops each night
- Currently serving South Shore, Pilsen, New City, Garfield Park and Northside Encampments
- Most clients report moderately stable housing and food is the most-accessed service

### Street Medicine Team



- Operates Monday Saturday, most days with 2 shifts
- During FY24, 55 unique service locations
- 90% of clients access medical services and 80% access case management
- 65% of clients report not having consistent access to harm reduction supplies outside of the Street Medicine Team

### CTA Outreach

- The Night Ministry first began outreach on the CTA as a pilot program in 2020 and has since expanded to provide over 15,000 outreach contacts in 2024.
- Our staff can be found on Wednesday night at the Howard Red Line station & Thursday night at the Forest Park Blue Line.
- Medical providers, case managers, outreach staff, and substance use specialists are all present on-site.
- The CTA program averaged 148 clients a night last year.







# **IMPACT in FY24**

- 912 ER visits prevented, saving \$1.7m
- 2,800+ health assessments conducted
- More than **3,000** case management visits
- 105 clients housed, 296 tents distributed
- 66k meals, 19,500 hygiene kits



### New Arrivals

- **47,580 new arrivals** have been welcomed in Chicago since August 2022.
- The Night Ministry has remained committed to providing services to all those in our community experiencing homelessness, including the new arrivals.
- When new arrivals were being housed in temporary staging areas (e.g., police stations, airports), our medical staff consistently provided care and treatment for a variety of conditions to the folks sheltering there.
- One System Initiative underway.





# Youth Programs

Safe & Stable Housing, Well-being, Permanent Connections, Education & Employment In FY2024, The Night Ministry served **553** young adults and **132** of their children



# Youth Programs

- Housing programs that range from overnight shelter to long-term residential programs
- Supportive services, like case management
- Housing programs include: The Crib, Interim, Parenting with Purpose, Pathways, and the Flexible Housing Pool


**Interim Housing:** Short-term shelter Ages 14 through 20 West Town neighborhood

### Parenting with Purpose Renovations



- The move to West Town addressed challenges such as no elevator and no private bathrooms.
- Worked with Humble Design to transform the rooms for our clients.



Pathways: 2 years of transitional housing Ages 18-24 North Lawndale\*



# **Flexible Housing Pool:**

- Supports 95 households in their own apartments
- Housing Case Managers provide support with moving costs, apartment fees, landlord communications, navigating federal assistance programs, and more.
- 98% of clients remained housed last year, 37% of clients were employed each month



# Youth 4 Truth

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## Youth Program Highlights

### **Clients Housed**

Youth programs transitioned **155** clients to safe and stable housing in FY2024.

### **Mental Health Services**

The team connected **73** clients to mental health services. \*

### **Permanent Connections**

The team assisted **165** clients to make a permanent connection while enrolled in a youth program.

### **Employment**

The youth programs team assisted **97** clients with finding or keeping a job.

### **Education**

A total of **64** clients enrolled in school while staying with us.

### **Case Management**

A total of **226** clients completed a goal while working with The Night Ministry.
