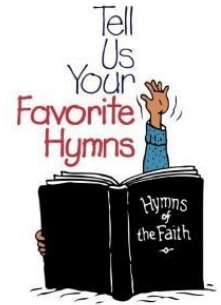

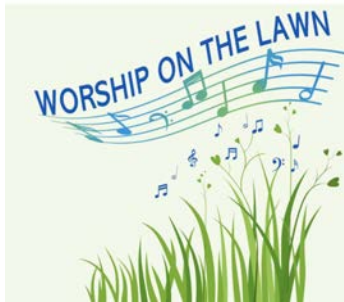
BACH COLLEGIUM VALPARAISO

On the occasion of the 300th anniversary of the composition of “St. John Passion” by J.S. Bach, the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians (in conjunction with Lutheran Summer Music) will sponsor a performance of this incredible masterwork.

Led by Christopher M. Cock, the Bach Collegium Valparaiso is an ensemble comprised of some of the best vocal and instrumental musicians in the greater Chicago area — many of these musicians specialize in the performance of early music, especially the works of J.S. Bach.

Christopher M. Cock founded the Bach Institute at Valparaiso University in 2004 and led Bach Institute ensembles on numerous concert tours and many performances both in the US and in Germany. He has personally conducted or sung nearly 100 performances of the passions of J.S. Bach.
