*Opening Words: Warren

One: The Prophet Micah told us that the LORD requires us to do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with God. As we celebrate Martin Luther King's witness, let us be called to worship by some of the prophets of the Civil Rights Movement.

In 1963, in his challenging letter to complacent white clergy in the South, Dr. King wrote, "We will have to repent in this generation not merely for the vitriolic words and actions of the bad people, but for the appalling silence of the good people. In the end, we will remember not the words of our enemies, but the silence of our friends."

All: O God, we pray, transform our silence into action, our fear into courage.

One: President John F. Kennedy in an address that led to the Civil Rights Act of 1964 said, "The heart of the question is whether all Americans are to be afforded equal rights and equal opportunities; whether we are going to treat our fellow Americans as we want to be treated."

All: O God, we pray, help us to love you and to love others as ourselves.

One: Rosa Parks said, "You must never be fearful about what you are doing when it is right. I have learned over the years that when one's mind is made up, this diminishes fear; knowing what must be done does away with fear."

All: O God, we pray, remind us that you did not give us a spirit of fear.

One: Ann Braden, a white Southern activist and ally of the Civil Rights movement wrote, "In every age, no matter how cruel the oppression carried on by those in power, there have been those who struggled for a different world. I believe this is the genius of humankind, the thing that makes us half divine: the fact that some human beings can envision a world that has never existed.

All: O God, we pray, help us to envision and struggle for a world where justice will roll down like water, righteousness like an ever-flowing stream.



ADULT ED: UNDERSTANDING OUR CONNECTIONS – THE QUR'AN AND THE BIBLE Jan 19, 10:45 - 11:45 Chapel / Zoom

We talk about three religious traditions as Abrahamic, or "People of the Book." These are Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. We are somewhat familiar with the primary religious text for Judaism, which we

call the Old Testament (or Hebrew Bible.) But most of us aren't very familiar with the Qur'an. Nor do we know how much the Qur'an and the Bible have in common.

Let's learn something new together! ME&O will be offering four classes in January and February focusing on the origins of the Qur'an and its intersections with the Bible. The first three classes will be taught by Sheikh Hassan Mostafa Aly, a noted Muslim scholar -- and a longtime friend of CPC. The fourth class will be a discussion between Sheik Aly and Reverend Doctor Robert Cathey. Dr. Cathey is a retired professor of theology from McCormick Seminary. All of these classes will be offered hybrid during our regular Adult Education hour.

A man went forth with gifts.

He was a prose poem. He was a tragic grace. He was a warm music.

He tried to heal the vivid volcanoes. His ashes are reading the world.

His Dream still wishes to anoint the barricades of faith and of control.

His word still burns the center of the sun above the thousands and the hundred thousands.

The word was Justice. It was spoken.

So it shall be spoken. So it shall be done.

Gwendolyn Brooks is one of the most influential and widely read 20th-century American poets. The author of more than 20 books, she was highly regarded even during her lifetime and had the distinction of being the first Black poet to win the Pulitzer Prize. A lifelong resident of Chicago, Gwendolyn Brooks was appointed Poet Laureate of Illinois in 1968, a position she held until her death 32 years later. She was also named the U.S. Poet Laureate for the 1985–86 term.
