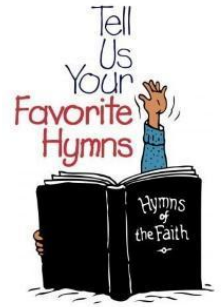
FAVORITE HYMN SUNDAY

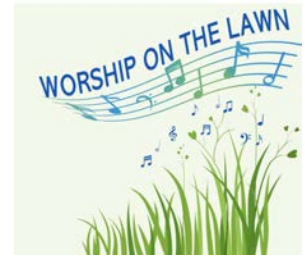

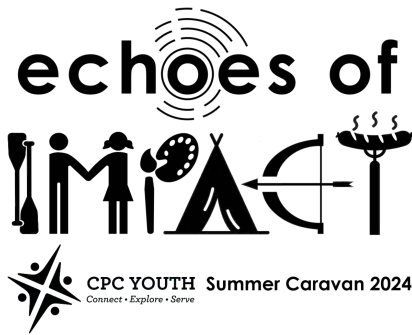
